See in the darkness. Light a candle. Watch what the flame does to the darkness. How does this light reflect God's light in your life, situations, todays culture? Thank God for His Light.

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Background

Genesis 1:1-2: In the beginning, God...

In ancient times there were many different myths/ stories circulating about the origins of the earth. Some involved multiple gods, dragons, demons... In these myths, when it rained too much (flood), too little (draught), when the earth shook (earthquake) or the crops failed (famine), people wondered if it was because the 'gods' were angry. Maybe sacrificing something/ someone to them would make them happier?



Genesis told a radically different story. It still does. *"In the beginning, God..."* (Genesis 1:1)

What we see around us is stunningly beautiful, incomprehensibly big (galaxies & cosmos), and yet at times unbelievably tiny. All 'this' is full of intricate patterns, rhythms, varieties, detail... And it's all held together in balance, harmony, relationship. For example, to survive, we humans breathe in oxygen (O²) and breathe out harmful-to-us carbon dioxide (CO²). Trees breathe in carbon dioxide, thrive on the carbon, and breathe out oxygen. Trees and humans are made for each other!

All 'this' must have a source – a beginning. It must have come from *somewhere* or *someone*. "In the BEGINNING, God"

Whatever/ whoever is The Source must be even more beautiful, big and powerful that all 'this'.

The Source deserves our worship. It's our instinctive response.

Such harmony couldn't have come from multiple, competing 'sources' (gods). There must only be One Source. *"In the beginning, GOD"* – <u>The</u> single, supreme Source. God – Yahweh.

The Source (God) seems interested, involved is all 'this'. God is not distant/ aloof/ unknowable. We can *interact* with God, we can *know* God, we can build *relationship*, even *friendship*, with God The Source

So Genesis is for anyone who's ever asked:

- Is there more to life than this?
- o Does it matter how I live my life, treat others, the environment?
- o Do I really matter?
- Why am I here?

Though written in a pre-scientific age, Genesis 1 tells a story about God, beginnings, and how we fit in

Genesis 1: 3-5: Day 1 - God said, "Let there be LIGHT"

In 'Days' 1-3 God separates and creates the spaces and in 'Days' 4-6 God fills those spaces. So in 'Day 1' God separates light from dark and creates night and day which the sun, moon and stars fill on 'Day 4'.

Light symbolises: God's presence (Ex.10:23;13:21-22), salvation (Ps.27:1), guidance (Ps.119:105).

God does not just create light, God <u>IS</u> Light – the Source of all light (1 John 1:5)

Just as some light is so bright we can't look at it, it's as if God is unapproachable light (1 Timothy6:16).

Yet, because Jesus is the light of the world (John 8:12), through Him, we can have relationship with God.

Being made in God's image, we are called to live as children of light (Ephesians 5:8-9).

"God saw the light was GOOD."

Light is foundational to life. We depend on light to grow our food and for Vitamin D. Light enables us to see and enjoy the beauty of Creation. Trees rely on light for their growth, birds navigate by it...

Electricity brings us more (artificial) light. Our 24-7 culture relies on it. It disconnects us from rhythms of natural light. Fossil-fuel power generation causes pollution & global warming – our climate emergency.

Let there be light from cleaner renewable energy e.g. solar, wind, wave...
