	When was the last time you faced a fear?			
Start	Have you ever had to overcome your fear? How did you do it?			
	How many Bible figures can you think of who were afraid?			
Discuss	How did their stories turn out?

Explore	<ul> <li>Read through verses 1-10. What reasons did the Israelites have to be afraid? Why was this mighty nation reduced to hiding in the clefts of mountains?</li> <li>v.6 - at what point in their difficulties did the Israelites turn to God for help?</li> <li>v.7-10 - what is God's initial response and how long does it seem He takes to send this prophet? Why do you think this is His first answer to the Israelites' cries for help? Is He simply punishing them or is there something else going on here?</li> <li>v.11 - what clues can you find that suggest that Gideon is afraid? How does the angel's term of address 'mighty warrior' seem ironic? Do you think it's intended to be sarcastic?!</li> <li>v.13 - how do you imagine Gideon's tone of voice? What reasons does he have for these views? Have you ever felt like this?</li> <li>v.14 - how does the Lord's response to Gideon answer his doubts, anger and questions?</li> <li>v.15-16 - can you think of other Bible figures who have had this kind of conversation with God? What happens next?</li> <li>What happens when fear meets faith? Can you think of an example of this from your own experiences and / or from the testimony of someone else?</li> <li>v.17 - is Gideon right to test the messenger or is this a sign of weakness and doubt? What does this response reveal about the Lord?</li> </ul>			
Go further	<ul> <li>Read <u>Philippians 4:4-9</u>. This very familiar passage commands the reader to rejoice <b>always</b> and to pray over any anxieties. How feasible is this?</li> <li>When have you acted on this and seen God fulfill his promise in verse 7?</li> </ul>
