| Explore | <ul> <li>Do you agree that we need friends? Why do you think this is? What evidence do you have to support your view?</li> <li>How do you know if a friendship is good, strong or genuine? What do you understand by the term 'false friend'?</li> <li>v.2: Why do you think the writer considers it wisdom for an 'outsider' to praise you, rather than to boast? How can we ensure we have people in our lives who encourage us and build us up? Take a moment to pause and identify these people in your own life.</li> <li>What's the difference between flattery and genuine encouragement? Do they have different outcomes? How can you discern them?</li> <li>v.5: How do we respond to rebuke from a friend who speaks from a place of love and concern? Why is it hard to do, and to receive? Can you think of examples in your own experiences?</li> <li>Can you think of examples where Jesus speaks truth in love to his nearest and dearest?</li> <li>v.6: How does Jesus model to us how to respond to kisses from an enemy? How might this translate into reality for us?</li> <li>Jesus picks up on this in Matthew 18:15. What does it say about your friendship if you are not prepared to speak truth into someone's life, to show them that God's got something better for them? Why do you think Jesus advises us to take the speck out of our own eye first?</li> <li>v.9: What does it mean to give heartfelt advice?</li> <li>Jesus models friendship in his relationships with the 12 disciples; what can we learn from his example?</li> </ul> |             |  |

| Go further    | <ul> <li>Read <u>1 Thessalonians 5:11-15.</u> What practical tips does Paul give the church here to help them spread the perfume of friendship?</li> <li>How does being in a small group enable you to live these out? What difference do you think small groups make to being part of a church family?</li> </ul> |  |
