Explore	 □ v.1 Why were people, religious and non-religious, so drawn to Jesus? How today do/ can we grow our 'crowd'? If they only knew <i>what</i>, would people 'crowd around' Jesus today? What can get in the way of this? □ v.2 Jesus saw and came to the fishermen while they were at work/ doing an everyday task. To what extent do you imagine Jesus coming to you in your work place/ everyday living? When 'out of the blue' have you sensed God 'speaking' to you? □ v.4 What if Jesus is saying the same thing to us? What should we do? Anticipate? □ v.5 What was Jesus demonstrating? When has God asked you to do something that, at the time, made little sense? □ v.6 What was Jesus now demonstrating? What's the significance for us today? □ v.7 What did the partners enable? Go further	 □ <u>Luke 5:1</u> What or <i>who</i> is the Word of God? See also <u>John 1:1-3</u>. "Jesus is the Word (Logos) of God, the Bible is the revelation of Jesus." Do you agree? What difference does this make? □ <u>Luke 5:10</u> The Greek phrase 'to fish' (<i>zogreo</i>) means to capture <u>alive</u>, like a hunter goes after its prey. How does this affect how you think about evangelism? How intentional should we be about going after people to help them come to faith in Christ?
Reflect	 □ What verse stands out? What verse challenges you the most? □ How comfortable/ confident do you feel about sharing your faith? Why is this? What would make more of a difference?
