Poscuss Discuss	 □ Why is inclusion so necessary? Why is it so challenging? Why is it so rewarding? □ Why do we often think we already are inclusive? □ How does our upbringing/ culture/ church experience(s) affect our approach to inclusion and "others"? □ Is God more inclusive than His followers?

Explore	U.1-2: What made Cornelius an 'outsider'? When have you felt an 'outsider'? How was Cornelius spiritual, if not 'one of us'? What does that say about others we know today? □ v.3-4: Why was Cornelius accepted by God, though not the church? □ v.5-6: Why was it radical for Peter to be staying with a tanner? □ v.7-8: How do we explain this reference to slavery? How do we explain the Bible's attitude to slavery? To be consistent, should our approach to the Bible be similar with LGBTQ+ inclusion? □ v.9-10: What are you like when you're hungry? How was Peter's vision influenced by his circumstances? To what extent does God speak through our circumstances/ feelings? Got an example? □ v.11-14: What did Peter see? What did God say? Why was this so shocking to Peter? How did his culture/ upbringing/ inherited teaching explain his reaction? Why was it not just bad taste, it was sinful? Going against Scripture? Read Leviticus 20:24-26 & Leviticus 11. What does this say to us today? □ v.15-16: What did God say? Why did Peter need to hear this multiple times? Why are we just the same? Why is there always more to inclusion? How in Acts 10 was theology (including Peter's) being shaped by experience? What does that mean for us and our understanding of God & His ways?	
Go further	 □ Read Leviticus 11 & Leviticus 20:24-26. How relevant are the Levitical food laws today? Should we be following them? If we take this approach with the food laws, should we be doing the same with other Levitical laws? If we don't, what does that say about us? □ Read Mark 7:1-23 Jesus declared all foods clean (v.19). Why should we read the whole of Scripture, including Leviticus, through the revelation of Christ? This is called a Christocentric hermeneutic (a great Scrabble score!)
