Start	What was a surprising truth you learnt this week? When do you experience love this week?			
Discuss	 Does <i>truth</i> matter? How important is what we believe? Theology/ doctrine? To what extent are our beliefs shaped by the Bible, Church teaching/ tradition, our personality/how we're wired, contemporary attitudes/values? Should true love trump all else?

Explore	 v.1: How do you decide what and who to believe? How do we/you test/ assess what they say and do? How do you spot a <i>false</i> prophet? v.2-3: How is this very <i>specific</i>? How is it also very <i>broad</i>? What do we unite around? Within that, what is there plenty of room/ scope for? What happens when you can't imagine the Jesus of the Gospels ['Jesus come in the flesh'] saying or doing what is being said/ done in His name? v.4-6: Why/ how do 'false prophets' (or teachers) often reflect 'world values/ attitudes' (not that of Christ's)? Why is it dangerous to rely on "<i>I just feel</i>" without Scripture? Why do we often need others to help us see/ discern truth more clearly? If we 'go it alone' what can happen to our understanding? v.7-8: Why is love central to Christian faith? Are <i>truth</i> and <i>love</i> either/or or both/and? Why? What is <i>truth</i> without <i>love</i>? What is <i>love</i> without <i>truth</i>? What does <u>Ephesians 4:15</u> suggest? v.9-10: What kind of love does God model? Everything Jesus said/ did was because 'God is Love'. v.11-12: How does us living in love and faith help others to experience God? What happens when we or others don't live by the 'rule of love'? v.1-18: Why do we need others to help us give/ receive love? What happens when we elevate 2nd/ 3rd/ 4th order beliefs over '1st order' (e.g. God is Love as revealed in Christ)? v.17-18: How does love reduce the power of fear? Why is fear often the absence of love? To what extent does your understanding of 'end times' judgement fit with 'God is Love'? v.19-21: Why does gathering with others ensure we maintain a healthy relationship with <i>love</i> and <i>truth</i>? 			
Go further	 What happens when other people's truth (their understanding/ beliefs) are different to ours? 1st Order beliefs are <u>absolutes</u>. They are core to Christian faith. They're what <i>all</i> 			
	Christians believe, whate	ver traditio	n, denomination.	

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	 2nd Order beliefs are <u>convictions</u>. They describe what we and other Christians <i>like us</i> think important - though other denominations may think differently to us. 3rd Order beliefs are <u>opinions</u>. Matters of difference between or within our congregations that needn't divide us. 		
	 4th Order are more like <u>questions</u> – unsettled issues we're all still wrestling with. Which one verse stands out to you? Why do you think it grabs your attention? 		
Reflect	 Which verse(s) will you need to think more about? Why? What does it mean to <i>know</i> and <i>rely</i> on the love God has for you? What's your experience of this? 		
Do	 Chose to gather with others for worship. Sit together as a small group. Meet afterwards. Ask God to reveal more of Hs truth and love in and through you to others.
