Discuss	 Why does the resurrection of Jesus make no sense? Why does the resurrection of Jesus make perfect sense? Why did all those who witnessed the resurrection prefer gruesome execution rather than deny what they had seen? In that culture, if you wanted to fabricate a resurrection myth, why place women at the heart of the story? How does Easter show that Jesus' actions spoke louder than words?

P Explore	 v.1: Why might Mary Magdalene have gone to the tomb? Why so early? What was her expectation? v.2: Why report to 'the disciples'? Why did an empty tomb make no sense? What explanations have you heard that explain a away the empty tomb? v.3-4: What was the dynamic between Peter and John? Why refer to him as 'Simon Peter'? v.5-6: How did these two react so differently to the same sight? How is our approach to faith shaped by our personality/ temperament? v.6-7: What was Simon Peter's response to the empty tomb? v.8: What was John's response to the empty tomb? v.9: Why did they not understand? They would have heard Jesus speak frequently about His death and resurrection. Why do we have 'blind spots'? v.10: What might that return journey have been like? 		
Go further	 Which one verse stands out to you? Why do you think it grabs your attention? Which verse(s) will you need to think more about? Why? Who do you identify with most in this incident: Mary, Simon Peter, ortJohn?
